PURPOSE OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

To assist and encourage a qualified graduating senior who has a desire to further his/her education at an institution of higher learning, whether it be a trade/technical school, college or university.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Qualification for a Tomball High School FFA Booster Club scholarship requires the student's family to have been a member in good standing in the organization for at least one (1) year prior to the student's senior (12th grade) year at Tomball High School. The family must also be a member in good standing in the organization during the student's senior (12th grade) year at Tomball High School. An exception will be made for any student transferring into THS prior to or including the student's senior year. All other eligibility requirements must be met for the current year.

ELIGIBILITY

The applicant must be a graduating Tomball High School senior who will have completed at least five (5) semesters (or 2 ½ years) of Agricultural Education from Tomball High School.

The applicant must have an overall 75% (C/2.5) or greater grade point average through the first semester of his/her senior year.

The applicant must submit a copy of his/her official high school transcript, signed and sealed by the school registrar, with the Tomball FFA Booster Club Scholarship Application.

In the event of a transfer student:

- 1. Credits will be determined by the student's transcript;
- 2. A letter of recommendation from the student's former Ag teacher in a sealed envelope must be submitted;
- 3. Student must have completed at least five (5) semesters (or 2 ½ years) of Agricultural Education from the previous high school;
- 4. A member must have paid membership dues and satisfied all other financial obligations to the Organization at or before the November meeting.

APPLICATION

The applicant must provide a sealed letter of recommendation from a Tomball High School staff member, excluding an agricultural teacher.

The applicant must be in good standing* in both school and community.

The applicant must have already earned or currently be seeking the State FFA Degree.

*Good standing means having no outstanding fees or dues owed to the Tomball FFA and or Tomball FFA Booster Club.

SELECTION PROCESS

Each applicant will be carefully examined and considered through an evaluation process, using an accurate scoring system to determine those to be selected.

The evaluation will be divided into the following categories: (see score sheet for points)

- 1. Scholastic Achievement (Academic G.P.A. and Agricultural Education G.P.A.) verified by a sealed transcript
- 2. FFA Leadership, Involvement and Activities
- 3. Other School Leadership and Activities
- 4. Community Leadership and Activities
- 5. Personal Essay
- 6. Personal Interview (in official dress)
- 7. Sealed Letter of Recommendation

All applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Selection Committee selected by the Tomball FFA Booster Club Scholarship Committee and at least one THS Agriculture Teacher for accuracy of information and scoring. The candidates that qualify will be given a date and time to have their personal interview. The interviewers will then add the interview points to the application. Scholarships will be announced at the Tomball FFA Annual Spring Awards Banquet. Applicants must be present at the Spring Awards Ceremony unless prior notice of an extenuating circumstance is given to the THS Agriculture Teachers.

All applications become the property of the Tomball FFA Booster Club.

The Scholarship Committee's decisions will be announced at the Annual Tomball FFA Spring Awards Banquet or in the event of cancellation of the Spring Banquet, a date to be determined by the Tomball FFA Booster Club will be given to applicants.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

Distribution of scholarship funds will begin when the Tomball FFA Booster Club Executive Committee becomes satisfied with the student's proof of enrollment and a qualifying course of study is assured. A minimum number of twelve (12) course hours per semester must be registered by the student with his/her selected degree granting institution. The initial scholarship award will be made at the beginning of the first semester payable directly to students. The second scholarship award will be made payable to the same at the start of the second semester only after sufficient proof of the student's successful completion of the first semester with a 75 (C/2.5) or greater G.P.A has been supplied. Any student that provides insufficient proof (ie. forged documentation, including transcripts or any document provided as proof of eligibility) will forfeit the remainder of the scholarship funds.
